1.1.2 The routine should show good form, execution, height, maintenance of height and opening in all elements to demonstrate perfect control of the body during the flying phase.

This has been added to now have an expectation of **OPENING IN ALL ELEMENTS** which means we will now be judging a lack of opening for basic shape jumps.

4 elements counting for difficulty for FIG A (Senior) in the first routine

6 **Clothing**

- 6.3 Bandages & supports no big contrast with skin colour. No underwear showing
- 6.4 Penalty for clothing violations is now <u>0.2 by the Chair</u> (This used to be 0.1 from total score)

7.3 Missing or required elements in the first routine- penalty of <u>2.0 by the difficulty judges</u> for <u>each</u> missing element. (Used to be 1.0 from each judge)

<u>Example 1</u> if at Worlds, a gymnast has Rudi out (P) **1.5**, half in Rudi out (P) **1.6**, as their counting starred skills but in order to save the routine puts a straddle jump in the routine they have missed a requirement (<u>which is 10 somersaults of 270' or more</u>) so the Difficulty judge would indicate a penalty deduction of 2.0 taken from the score total.

<u>Example 2</u> If a there is a compulsory routine with specific elements in it, but one the elements is missed, there needs to be a deduction for this of **2.0** for this again there would be a **2.0** penalty deduction for the routine total score issued by the difficulty judge}

9 Safety

In the past in rule 9 it talks about <u>a country</u> replacing up to <u>two</u> of the <u>4 spotters</u> with their own spotters. There is no longer any mention of 4 spotters. However, on safety grounds it would still be preferred that we continue to have 4 spotters for competitions (or two spotters where the beds are put together.)

9.1.2 A spotter mat may be used by the competitor's own spotter(s) from **both** sides of the trampoline.

13 **Start of a Routine**

Penalty for delayed start is now taken from by the <u>Chair of Judges</u> instead of the execution

15 **Repetition of Elements**

15.1 Repetition of an element in the first routine – **penalty of 2.0 by the difficulty judge** from the total score. (This used to be **1.0** by each execution judge)

16 Interruption to a routine

16.9.1 Better clarification as to what is a *half an element ahead* of a partners in synchro which constitutes and interruption to the routine

17 <u>Termination of a routine</u>

17.2 Uncontrolled out-bounce will cause a **0.1** deduction. (21.3.2)

This is <u>in addition</u> to the end of routine deductions so an uncontrolled out bounce and some

steps could now be up to **0.3** deduction.

17.3 Synchro - if gymnasts have a different ending (i.e. one out-bounces and one doesn't) there is a penalty of **0.4** from the Chair of Judges, From the total score. (Previously this was 0.2 from the synchro score)

17.5 More than 10 elements in a routine, a penalty of **2.0 by the Chair of Judges**. (This used to be 1.0 by each execution judge.)

18 Scoring

Introduction to scoring – 5 types of marks given,

D - Difficulty,

E - Execution

H - Horizontal displacement,

T – Time of Flight,

S - Synchronisation

- 18.1 Quadruple somersaults performed by Youth/Juniors = <u>disqualification</u>.
- The evaluation of execution, horizontal displacement and difficulty is done in 10ths of a point.

 The synchronization is evaluated in 1/100 of a point.

 The time of flight is evaluated in 1/1000 of seconds.
- 18.2.6 Evaluation of the score for horizontal displacement (H):
 - The evaluation of the horizontal displacement should be done electronically
 - The horizontal displacement deductions for each element are subtracted from the maximum mark, i.e., 10.0 points, or the mark decided by the CJP.
 - If the electronic scoring system is not available, Execution Judges 5 & 6 will be responsible to evaluate the horizontal displacement instead of execution. Their marks will be **averaged** and taken as the "H" score

18.2.7 Evaluation of the score for time of flight (T):

The evaluation of the Time of Flight mark should be done electronically controlled by the Chair of Judges' Panel.

18.2.8 Evaluation of the score for Synchronization (S):

The evaluation of the Synchronized mark should be done electronically controlled by the Chair of Judges' Panel.

18.2.5.2 Scoring for Individual competition

Execution to be out of **20** instead of <u>30</u>.

Horizontal Displacement (H) to be out of 10.

To have only 2 execution counting judges using 6 judges (removing 2 high and 2 low scores).

6 judges are used where there is electronic HD equipment

At competitions where there is **no** electronic HD equipment use only <u>4 judges</u> (removing high and low scores). Then 2 judges will judge Horizontal Displacement (average of their scores).



21.3.2 - Lack of stability after a completed routine.

Uncontrolled movements in the out-bounce must also be judged as part of the instability.

Example of deductions for out-bounce (maximum	0.1 pt) :
 Uncontrolled movements in the out-bounce 	0.1
Example of deductions for landing (maximum	0.2 pts) :
 Movement of arms while standing on the bed (ex. circle) 	0.1
Step(s) or bounce(s)	0.1 - 0.2
Not standing upright	0.1
Standing with feet apart or more than shoulder width	0.1
 Turning to the judges before being totally stabilized 	0.1

- The penalty is not connected to the length of the step or the bounce, but to the amount.
- When a step is taken (deduction 0.1 pts), coming back with the same foot to a stable upright position is not considered to be a stepping deduction.
- Total deductions for instability in out-bounce and landing must not exceed <u>0.3</u>

It has been confirmed by FIG that column 2 where there is a < symbol representing a piked skill, this is wrong, the scores in this column should represent tucked or pucked skills, column 2 should be a < or / symbol representing piked or straight elements. So there is no change to our difficulty judging as per rule 18.1.1 Tra Cop.

Guidance Drawings

There are clearer guidance drawings with additional guidance for opening of somersaults from back and front landings and also for piking or tucking down for these landings as well as diagrams to show the body and feet positions to decide which zone a gymnast is in for horizontal displacement.

L Requirements for first routines Tra FIG events (Jan 2017)

In the first routine this is now 4 elements with a diff score (which obviously will not count for difficulty if repeated in the 2^{nd} routine.
